MASSP SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

The Michigan Association of Secondary School Principals (MASSP) provides a number of scholarships for the MASC/MAHS Summer Leadership Camps. These scholarships will be awarded to student council or honor society students interested in attending one of the camps that exhibit a financial need. The principal, council or chapter must be a member of MASSP or MASC/MAHS, respectively. Eligible and interested students must submit a completed Applicant Overview Form (see page 2), including personal and adviser essays, in order to be considered for a scholarship. No more than two students from a school will be awarded scholarships. Schools with more than two (2) interested students should select which two students will submit applications to MASSP. The number of applications handed out each year varies.

Middle School Leadership Camp: July 18-21, 2010 @ Albion College

Cost: \$300/student (member school), Scholarship: \$200

High School Leadership Camp: July 25-30., 2010 @ Albion College

Cost: \$400/student (member school), Scholarship: \$300

What do students do at the MASC/MAHS Summer Leadership Camps?

Students are placed in random leadership groups (separate from schoolmates), supervised by two staff members. Throughout the week, students sit in on interactive and experiential lessons that guide them through various aspects of leadership (see details below). The students are also responsible for a number of tasks throughout their days with us. Councils take on the task of developing leadership challenges, News of the Day presentations, camp-wide mixers, leadership skits, service projects, photo display boards, reflection sessions and a variety of other activities and presentations.

What skills will students develop/learn at the Leadership Camps?

There are a variety of lessons and skills that students will be exposed to throughout their days at our camp. Below is a list of some of the general ideas students will walk away with. Each camp level (Middle School, High School 1st Year, High School 2nd Year, and High School 3rd Year) experiences unique curriculum that varies slightly from the areas below as well as expands on a number of other leadership areas.

- **Communication Skills:** to relay and understand information effectively (listening & speaking) in large and small groups using a variety of mediums
- **Organization & Managerial Skills:** to plan and implement projects, facilitate meetings and understand the structure of their respective leadership group
- **Service & Citizenship:** to take responsibility for personal actions and to act ethically; to understand their responsibility to the community around them
- **Group Process:** to interact in groups effectively, develop cohesiveness, understand leadership/personality styles, utilize strategies for problem solving and conflict resolution and to facilitate decision-making processes
- **Goal Setting:** to formulate individual and group goals, as well as set, identify and evaluate goals
